Section 5 – Important Notices to Parents/ Guardians

1. For all coaching sessions we start promptly so please ensure children arrive before the start time. Parents must ensure that children are collected no later than the end of the session.
2. BHJFC assumes no responsibility or liability for any injury/ damage to any person, persons or property whether resulting from taking part in any activity of the club or otherwise. BHJFC will take all necessary steps to contact the parent/ nominated person in the event of illness or injury.
3. Parents/ Guardians are responsible for the transport arrangements of their children to and from the venue of coaching, practice session and matches.
4. In the event of your child leaving the club playing kit must be returned to your coach within 14 days, if the kit is not returned a minimum fee of £30 will be due. Subscription fees are not usually refunded except at the committee's discretion.
5. The team coaches decide each player's place in each team – not the players or parents! Our coaches are taught by the Football Association that players should be moved around to fully develop skills in all areas of the pitch. Coaches reserve the right to move players between teams at their sole discretion as players develop at different stages throughout the season.
6. BHJFC have FA trained Child Welfare Officers who can be contacted in confidence if you or your child have any concerns which your coach may not be able to help with – Jemma Wisdom welfare@beaconhilljfc.com
7. To maintain a supportive environment for the players we ask you to refrain from giving coaching instructions to your child during a match. We have trained volunteer coaches to do this and it can lead to mixed messages for a child. This is in line with current FA youth development guidelines.
8. Parking is very limited at Hindhead Playing Fields. Please park as directed. DOGS ARE NOT ALLOWED.

Section 6 – Club Code of conduct

Please remember that parents and coaches give up their free time to help so all players must show respect to each other, opposition players and coaches, referees and their own team manager. Inappropriate behavior will result in being barred from coaching and matches at the club's discretion.

BHJFC follows the FA Respect "Code of Conduct" for players, parents and spectators which must be read and signed by both BHJFC player and their parent or guardian. The player *and* parent must sign the player form. A parent must sign the parent and spectator form, these are included in this application.

Section 7 – Subscriptions

Subscription payments are to be made via our online team management system TeamStuff. The fees are **£170.00 for the season**, if you have not received access to TeamStuff please contact your coach. (The fees cover training costs, match day costs for league and cup fixtures, referees, pitches, insurance, league subscriptions, county subscriptions etc...). **ALL SUBSCRIPTIONS ARE DUE BY 30th SEPTEMBER LATEST PLEASE! Please note that if you have two or more children playing for the club then the first (eldest) child pays full subs and each subsequent sibling's subs are discounted by 25%.**

I may be:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Required to meet with the club, league or County FA Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Obligated to undertake an FA education course
- Obligated to leave the match venue by the club
- Requested by the club not to attend future games
- Suspended or have my club membership removed
- Required to leave the club along with any dependents.

In addition:

- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club.

Young Players

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game.

As a player, you have a big part to play. That's why The FA is asking every player to follow a Respect Code of Conduct.

When playing football, I will:

- Always play to the best of my ability
- Play fairly - I won't cheat, complain or waste time
- Respect my team-mates, the other team, the referee or my coach/manager
- Play by the rules, as directed by the referee
- Shake hands with the other team and referee at the end of the game
- Listen and respond to what my coach/ team manager tells me
- Talk to someone I trust or the club welfare officer if I'm unhappy about anything at my club.

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA or The FA:

I may:

- Be required to apologise to my team-mates, the other team, referee or team manager
- Receive a formal warning from the coach or the club committee
- Be dropped or substituted
- Be suspended from training
- Be required to leave the club.

In addition:

- My club, County FA or The FA may make my parent or carer aware of any infringements of the Code of Conduct
- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and suspension against my club.
